

Summary – Historic preservation organizations listening session 1

Meeting date: Thursday, Feb. 20, 1 p.m. Location: 1500 Jefferson, Olympia

DES provided an update on the rulemaking process, shared a rulemaking process map, and shared that concepts for future phases on the process map will be influenced by what DES hears at listening sessions and may be updated.

DES asked historic preservation organizations what is important to them and what questions they have. Group discussed:

- The importance of actions that could impact the ground
- There are numerous archeological sites along Deschutes Parkway
- Future activities that may have an impact on the site
- Issues with sewage dumping and enforcement
- · Availability of restrooms in the area
- Concerns related to digging in wooded areas
- Impacts of camping on hardscape areas like roads vs forested areas
- Shoreline areas as a focal point for archeology

DES asked for thoughts and advice regarding additional engagements and information to consider. Group discussed:

- Engagements with long-term parkers
- Legal issues related to impacting archeological sites
- How to obtain archeological surveys
