Presentation:

- Original approval was acquired December 3, 2020.
- Requesting Alternative Subcontractor Selection Process (ASSP) for Mass Timber Structural System.
- Design Phase fees offset by schedule advantage of early procurement
- WWU, GC/CM & M/ECCM's committed to meet or exceed 20% DBI
- Public Benefit includes early integrated collaboration of Mass Timber Manufacturer consultants avoids conflicts during design, scheduling, and procurement.
- Meets all RCW criteria

Deliberation:

WWU is the first in Washington to use mass timber this way on this scale. The panel was very interested in how this system will be integrated and expressed interest in following this project. The lessons that will be learned would be very helpful for owners considering the same system down the road. CMT mass timber projects like this are very tricky, as the details have to happen during manufacturing and not on the construction site. It's helpful to have the manufacturer as part of the design and construction team.

- Have over 75 staff with DB experience and 52 with DBIA Certifications. Staff development includes DB training offered to all staff.

Presentation:

- Project Cost: \$42 M.
- Full concrete paving and underground infrastructure replacement and upgrade to include storage tanks, drainage, trolley infrastructure, and utilities.
- Must remain operational during construction, geotechnical issues, heavy sequencing and phased implantation\scheduling needed for success.
- Heavy Civil
- Well qualified team with experience and capacity for success.
- Project meets all RCW requirements for GC/CM.

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Public Comment:

Mike Shinn, Shinn Mechanical: I just hope that the county follows the RCW's on this project and remind them they have to list their subcontractors, whether it be an electrician, a plumber, etc. They need to list even themselves if they wish to self-perform.

Deliberation:

The panel felt this project is a suitable use of GC/CM Heavy Civil. While many of the technical issues have been acknowledged, the Owner is advised to make sure to incorporate an allowance for time adjustments as the scope is refined and unknowns are identified. This owner is known to be very inclusive, but they are cautioned to remember to address it in their presentations and not rely solely on their reputation. Owner is cautioned to include in the project advertisement that this is a Heavy Civil project. The panel took the time to clarify that this project is not requesting Alternative Subcontractor Selection, and will return to the PRC if it is determined they wish to do so down the road.

Presentation:

- Project Cost: \$75M.
- Conversion of 2 floors in the Maleng Building into inpatient units and renovation of NJB for outpatient use to increase number of single patient room capacity across the Harborview complex.
- 2 phased project as the facilities must remain operational during construction.
- Project meets all the RCW criteria.
- Project team has extensive experience to perform progressive Design-Build.

Public Comment:

Pete Maslenikov with Skanska: Hello, I'm Pete Maslenikov with Skanska. I'd like to state just our support for the approval of the Harborview Maleng Single Bed project in their application for the use of progressive Design-Build as a delivery method. You know there's many benefits that King County can and will realize by contracting under this method. You know and some of them were mentioned, where the expedition of schedule, where we can start work ahead of the completion of design. Additionally, it allows the team to design to a target budget, and you have better accuracy of your budgets and your ability to meet those target budgets. And then lastly, it really does offer a more flexible method in procuring subcontractors and a better way of gaining equity and inclusion and contracting with local minority women and disadvantage businesses. And so, for all these reasons, we at Skanska are in support of approving the Maleng project as a progressive Design-Build delivery method. Thank you.

Deliberation:

This is a good project for Design-Build, as the progressive approach will help flesh out the scope and manage the project risks. A couple of items that were not in the presentation but were in the application are the importance of the preplanning disruption mitigation activities, and utility shutdown procedures which are critical to maintaining patient care during construction. Additionally, the ability to investigate spaces during the design and utilize technology, and especially the MEP are important supporting factors for the use of progressive design-build for this project. The application was thorough and concise with good application of lessons learned from their prior project.
