- Eight original turbine-generator units and associated balance of plant systems have exceeded their 40-year useful life. Refurbishment and potential replacement of the Draft Tube Gate Cylinders, Hydraulic Power Units, and auxiliary systems for all units will ensure another 40 years of reliable/efficient operation.
- Funding is in place
- Meets RCW Requirements for DB
- Experienced in-house and consultant team, continuity of District personnel
- Unanimous Approval

PUBLIC UTILITY DISTRICT OF CHELAN COUNTY DB

- Rock Island Dam Powerhouse #2 Generator Main Leads Replacement
- Project Cost: \$6,436,648
- Second largest publicly-owned hydro generation facility in U.S. serving 50,000 customers across 3,000 sq miles.
- Removal, Redesign, and Replacement of existing 1,400 foot cable bus system to meet all current seismic and increased use requirements for all 8 turbine-generator units. While this is a separate project from the Draft Tube Gate Hydraulic Power Unit and Cylinder Upgrade project, this project will take place separately and concurrently with each individual unit as it is taken off line.
- Funding is in place
- Meets RCW Requirements for DB
- Experienced in-house and consultant team, continuity of District personnel
- Unanimous Approval

CITY OF REDMOND GC/CM

- Redmond Senior Center Building Project
- Project Cost: \$45.7M
- Current facility is located on the Redmond Municipal Campus adjacent to the Sammamish River, and other occupied facilities. This building was closed in 2019 due to the discovery of catastrophic failure of the

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structural integrity, deeming it unfit for occupancy. Project is to demolish and reconstruct the facility in its current location.
