I am a DBIA Designated Design-Build Professional and a LEED Accredited Professional. I participated on the sub-committee for developing changes for the reauthorization of the Alternate Public Works Contracting Procedures in 2007 including establishment of the Project Review Committee. I am a registered architect and was with NBBJ Architects for fifteen years prior to going to the University of Washington in 1996.
