

Introductions - Northshore School District (NSD)



- NSD is one of the largest school districts in WA state, serving over 22,000 students at 20 elementary, six middle, & four high schools as well as seven choice programs ranging from Pre-K to beyond 12th grade.

Why GC CM?

Complex Phasing and Site

- Phased replacement
- Inflexible delivery schedule due to school calendar
- Ongoing operations during construction
- Ensure safety of students, staff and community





Why GC CM?

GC | CM Procurement Process

NSD plans to use a three step GC/CM selection model:

- Request for Qualifications (RFQ)
 - Focus on relevant experience, proposed team and approach
- 2. Interviews
 - Interviews may include office visits
 - Focus on team members proposed for the work
- 3. Request for Fee Proposal (RFFP)
 - Fee and Specified General Conditions
 - Focus on competitive and reasonable fees

Existing Site Plan:





- Remove Portables



Estimated project construction costs (including construction contingencies)	\$75,000,000
Equipment and furnishing costs	\$2,250,000
Off-site costs	Included
Contract administration costs (owner, cm etc.)	\$2,250,000
Contingencies (design and owner)	\$3,750,000
Other related project costs (permits, utilities, testing, inspection, moving)	\$3,250,000
Sales Tax	\$7,500,000
Total	\$100,000,000

Funding – The project is funded by a \$425M Bond passed by Northshore School District voters on February 8, 2022.
