

## Capitol Campus Services

Enterprise Services maintains the state's Capitol Campus in Olympia, which covers more than 486 acres, including four parks and the 260-acre Capitol Lake. The department also plans and cares for all memorials and monuments on the grounds.



## Key program services

### Buildings and Grounds

This group is responsible for the operation and preservation of all buildings on the campus, state-owned parks in Olympia and other state facilities within Thurston County. The program, which is part of the Facilities Division, includes electricians, carpenters, HVAC technicians, gardeners, plumbers, environmental specialists, custodians and trades professionals. This program oversees the operation of fire protection and security systems in the buildings, and operates the power plant, which runs 24 hours a day throughout the year.

### Visitor Services manages tours, activities

The Visitor Services office has responsibility for key major duties in managing events, activities and displays on the Capitol Campus. These often involve the coordination of rallies that take place during legislative sessions.

Events and activities can be scheduled through an [online permit application](#). Specific [guidelines](#) apply. Visitor Services also maintains an online [event calendar](#) that can be accessed at any time. The office is located in the Legislative Building.

Visitor Services also welcomes up to 200,000 visitors annually to the Capitol Campus and provides free guided tours for school children and other groups. Volunteers conduct most of the tours.

- Monday - Friday: 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Weekends: 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- Holidays (except Thanksgiving and the day after, Christmas and New Year's Day): 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.
