Construction work shifts to daytime schedule

Some of the exterior repair work at the Natural Resources Building that has been done outside of normal business hours has been shifted to an earlier schedule – from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. – to take advantage of the current dry, warm weather.

The schedule change is being done on a trial basis. If construction noise becomes a problem for building tenants, Enterprise Services will readjust the work schedule.

This week, workers will begin installing new gypsum sheathing board, which is used as an underlayment for the new exterior cladding. This work will create some intermittent, repetitive drilling noise. Most of this work will be done near the building rotunda.

Demolition work and wall replacement will progress from the top of the building to the bottom and from the west side to the east.

Air quality results

The industrial hygienist on the project collected some new air samples from the NRB on Sept. 6. The samples taken from conference rooms on the third and fourth floors did not show elevated fungal spores inside the building compared to the entrance.
