BDAG DES Procurement Engagement

- BDAG has said they would like to be involved with procurements prior to solicitations and contract execution.
 - Market research prior to a solicitation, is encouraged.
 - o Post contract execution reflection on lessons learned is encouraged.
 - No information can be provided by DES that would give vendor(s) an unfair advantage.
 - Transparency is important to ensure there is not a perception of influencing or information sharing.
 - Anyone can schedule 1:1 meetings with procurement staff (within our procurement rules).



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Agenda focus: Services

 Procurements are becoming more complicated with businesses and customers wanting to move away from 2-tier contracts. Some procurements also have more complex elements such as changes in laws.
