Directions: From I-5 Southbound:

Take I-5 Exit 105A. Where traffic merges, change to the left-hand lane. Using the roundabout, turn left onto Jefferson St. The building is immediately on your left.

From I-5 Northbound:

Take I-5 Exit 105A, and stay left. Using the roundabout, turn left onto Jefferson St. The building is immediately on your left.

Parking

The 1500 Jefferson visitor lot has a two-hour limit. There are sixteen regular stalls, two fifteen-minute stalls, and two ADA stalls. The entrance is the first left turn after you exit the roundabout. Follow the driveway toward the building entrance, then turn right to access the visitor lot. If you need to park for longer than two hours or the spots are already full, additional visitor parking can be accessed by taking the first right turn onto Maple Park and taking an immediate right. Metered street parking is available on a first-come, first-served basis on Maple Park Ave and on 14th Ave. Capitol Campus parking costs \$1.50/hr. weekdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., but is free on evenings and weekends. Parking fees can be paid by credit/debit card, \$1 bills or coins.
