Chapter 200-330 Small Works Roster	<p>The 2023 Legislature passed E2SB 5268, Efficiency and Equity in Public Works Contracting, to increase equity in public works contracting by helping small, minority, women, and veteran-owned businesses secure public works contracts. Key elements of the bill:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Establish a statewide works roster and a small business certification program. • Align financial thresholds throughout the state. • Add a direct contracting option. • Require DES to create public works bid templates for state agencies with public work authority. <p>Rulemaking is needed to align the current rules with the bill.</p>	<p>The CR-101 was filed 2023.</p> <p>We anticipate filing Proposed Rules (CR-102) early fall 2023.</p>
