Chapter 200-330 Small Works Roster	 The 2023 Legislature passed E2SB 5268, Efficiency and Equity in Public Works Contracting, to increase equity in public works contracting by helping small, minority, women, and veteran-owned businesses secure public works contracts. Key elements of the bill: Establish a statewide works roster and a small business certification program. Align financial public works contracting thresholds throughout the state. Add a direct contracting option. Require DES to create public works bid templates for state agencies with public work authority. Rulemaking is needed to align the current rules with the bill. 	The proposed rules public comment period ended January 12, 2024. We anticipate filing a permanent rule making order (CR-103) in February 2024.
