POLYCHLORINATED BIPHENYLS INTENT



- DES is proposing some changes to improve the current PCBs policy.
- Provide an overview of proposed policy revisions
- DES is seeking feedback on proposed revisions. Address –questions

PCBS POLICY REFRESH – CURRENT STATUS

• DES has obtained feedback from subject matter expert stakeholders.

PCBs

- DES developed an initial draft revised policy and an additional Frequently Asked Question (FAQ).
- DES wants to share the proposed draft and FAQ with other stakeholders.

PCBS – WHAT ARE THEY?

- A group of manufactured chemical compounds
- Persistent and long lasting in the environment
- Toxic
- Present everywhere, including air, water, and land



(Polychlorinated biphenyls)

PCBs – REASONS THEY ARE HARMFUL

- PCBs have toxic effects to the:
 - Immune system
 - Reproductive system
 - Nervous system
 - Endocrine systems
- Accumulate in people and animals





PCBs – SOURCES

- Manufacturing of PCBs was banned in 1979.
- Today, PCBs enter the environment through:
 - Hazardous waste sites
 - Illegal dumping
 - Leaks in old electrical transformers
 - Burning of waste in incinerators



INADVERTENT PCBs

Inadvertent PCBs (iPCBs), by-products from manufacturing other products, such as paints and printing inks.

Testing is

expensive

Very few labs test

Difficult for small businesses to test

PCBs

Current requirements may decrease the number of products tested for PCBs.

PCBs – PROPOSED CHANGES


PCBs

- ✓ Alternative option to PCB testing
- Promote the use of the <u>ChemForward iPCB Pigments</u>
 <u>Resource</u> which can be used to find alternatives products that do not contain iPCBs
- To provide a new verification form in the policy that allows vendors to verify the use of the iPCB Pigments Resource

PCBs POLICY – NEW FAQ

New FAQ #4 explains how to use the **ChemForward iPCB Pigments Resource** and verification form.


