WHAT IS THE PROCUREMENT RISK ASSESSMENT?



- Required by statute
- Applies to state agencies (not higher education)
- Results of the risk assessment are used for setting delegated authority limits
- Assessments conducted in 2014, 2016, and 2019



- Contract Audits performed by DES
- Reports from WEBS, Training, and Agency Contract Report

Not in Scope




- Agency's budget and financial processes

Contract Audit Rubric

Section: Supplier Diversity Policy

Requirement: Conduct an unbundling analysis for every competitive solicitation

DES analysis: Review contract(s) and/or contract documents

DES conclusion: assign pass/fail score

- Assign "pass/fail" for meeting the thresholds for each policy.
- The number of "pass/fail" will identify the delegated authority analysis results.


Phase 2 – draft delegated authority analysis:

Policies in Compliance	DES Analysis	Risk Rating	Delegated Authority Change
All 16	Model Agency	Low	Consider increase, if requested
14-15	Indicate areas for improvement	Medium-Low	Consider increase, if requested
11-13	Indicate areas for improvement	Medium-High	No change
8-10	Indicate areas for improvement	High	No change or decrease delegated authority
7 or less	Require quarterly meetings	High-Suspended	Decrease or suspend delegated authority


OTHER POLICY PROJECTS
