Dear Talia Baker and CPARB/PRC Members,

I would greatly appreciate your consideration for the PRC's open Design Industry Architect seat. As a Washington resident for twenty years, I bring a strong sense of responsibility to supporting project teams and clients in being thoughtful stewards of state funding when entrusted with public work. Quite often, architects engage with projects after key decisions—such as delivery model selection—have already been made through RFQ or RFP development. I would consider it a privilege to contribute earlier in the process, helping to shape how public projects are conceived, structured, and delivered for the greatest public benefit.

I am a Principal and licensed architect with the Miller Hull Partnership, where I lead our higher education market sector group, working with institutions across the state of Washington. My experience centers on building consensus, fostering equitable stakeholder relationships, and managing projects across a range of delivery models. I am particularly passionate about progressive design-build and other collaborative, integrated approaches that rely on trust, transparency, and respect among owners, stakeholders, designers, and builders.

Over the past five years, I have led four major projects for Washington state higher education institutions delivered using alternative public works delivery models. In addition, I have collaborated closely with institutional leaders at Washington State University, Western Washington University, and the University of Washington during project formation and funding development. This work has included facilitating strategic evaluations of traditional design-bid-build and alternative delivery methods, as outlined in RCW 39.10, to ensure the best value for public investment.

I am DBIA-certified and actively engaged in advancing the profession. In addition to guest lecturing at the University of Washington's College of Built Environments on the role of architects and designers in all delivery models, I regularly present at local, regional, and national forums on design within alternative delivery models. This engagement helps a broad range of AEC professionals—from specifications writers to project managers—better understand the opportunities and responsibilities these models entail. In addition to being an active DBIA member, for the last year, I have also participated in the national DBIA Design Professionals committee, bringing the viewpoint of architects and designers to conversations about design excellence in design build and the evolution of the role of the Design Integration Manager.



This has included supporting content development for DBIA's new Advanced Certification for Design Integration Managers.

My experience, combined with a deep commitment to the quality and stewardship of public works, positions me to contribute meaningfully to the PRC. Thank you for your consideration of my application.
