



PREPROPOSAL STATEMENT OF INQUIRY

CR-101 (June 2004)
(Implements RCW 34.05.310)
Do **NOT** use for expedited rule making

Agency: Department of Enterprise Services

Subject of possible rule making:

Update 200-110 WAC Local Government Self-Insurance health and welfare program

Statutes authorizing the agency to adopt rules on this subject:

RCW 48.62.061 Rule making by state risk manager—Standards

Reasons why rules on this subject may be needed and what they might accomplish:

Statutory changes require amending current rules and creating new rules in order to resolve incorrect references, align with recent amendments to other self-insurance rules, and align with the transfer of State Risk Management from OFM to DES

Identify other federal and state agencies that regulate this subject and the process coordinating the rule with these agencies:

The Department of Enterprise Services (DES) will communicate and coordinate with the Office of Insurance Commissioner, which has an interest in the rules governing joint self-insurance programs, as necessary. DES will also communicate with the State Auditor's office, which is currently responsible for financial and accountability audits of local government and nonprofit risk pools.

DES staff will hold a series of workshops in order to develop a proposed rule with anyone interested. An opportunity will also be provided for anyone to submit written comments on the proposed rules during the public comment period and present oral testimony at the public hearings.
