This change is restricted to liability coverage only.</li> <li>• Provide improved understanding of the rules relative to reserve levels. This clarification change will not change rule requirements.</li> </ul>   | While work was paused due to the impacts of the pandemic, work has re-started. We anticipate filing a Pre-Notice of Inquiry (CR-101) in February.  |
| <a href="#">Chapter 200-220 WAC</a><br>Use of the Public Areas of the Capitol Buildings and Grounds | Amend rule to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Align rules with current practices;</li> <li>• Make rules easier to understand and apply;</li> <li>• Address changing needs of the Capitol Campus;</li> <li>• Align with new legislation. Effective May 13, 2021, <a href="#">Senate Bill 5038</a> prohibits open carry of certain weapons at the state Capitol in Olympia. The law applies to all buildings on campus, state legislative offices, any public legislative hearing or meeting, and west Capitol Campus grounds.</li> </ul> | We anticipate filing a Pre-Notice of Inquiry (CR-101) with the Office of the Code Reviser in early spring.   |
