Named for Ulysses S. Grant, 18th President of the United States

**Traditional home of Moses-Columbia and Wanapum
American Indian people**

Dramatic desert canyons and cliffs, carved by staggering Ice Age floods, mix with clear lakes and reservoirs in wide-open, sunny Grant County. Massive Grand Coulee Dam – built in the 1930s in the county's northeastern corner – brought agricultural irrigation to central Washington, turning desert land into farms.

TRADITIONAL HOME OF SINKHUSE AND WANAPUM AMERICAN INDIAN PEOPLE
DRAMATIC DESERT CANYONS AND CLIFFS, CARVED BY STAGGERING ICE AGE FLOODS,
MIX WITH CLEAR LAKES AND RESERVOIRS IN WIDE-OPEN, SUNNY GRANT COUNTY.
MASSIVE GRAND COULEE DAM - BUILT IN THE 1930S IN THE COUNTY'S NORTHEASTERN
CORNER - BROUGHT AGRICULTURAL IRRIGATION TO CENTRAL WASHINGTON,
TURNING DESERT LAND INTO FARMS.
