COUNTY SEAT: FRIDAY HARBOR

Named for the San Juan Islands, which were christened in honor of St. John the Baptist by Spanish explorer Juan Francisco de Eliza

Traditional year-round home of the Lummi American Indian people, and summer home to a half dozen Salish-language tribes

San Juan County is made up of 172 islands that lie off the Washington mainland in Northern Puget Sound. These islands were jointly occupied by Britain and the United States from 1859 until 1872, when the International Boundary Dispute was settled by Kaiser Wilhelm I of Germany in favor of the U.S. Today San Juan County is known as a place of exceptional untamed beauty, home to bald eagles, orca whales, porpoises, otters and deer.

NAMED FOR THE SAN JUAN ISLANDS, WHICH WERE CHRISTENED IN HONOR OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST BY SPANISH EXPLORER JUAN FRANCISCO DE ELIZA

TRADITIONAL YEAR-ROUND HOME OF THE LUMMI AMERICAN INDIAN PEOPLE AND SUMMER HOME TO A HALF DOZEN SALISH-LANGUAGE TRIBES

SAN JUAN COUNTY IS MADE UP OF 172 ISLANDS THAT LIE OFF THE WASHINGTON MAINLAND IN NORTHERN PUGET SOUND. THESE ISLANDS WERE JOINTLY OCCUPIED BY BRITAIN AND THE UNITED STATES FROM 1859 UNTIL 1872, WHEN THE INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY

DISPUTE WAS SETTLED BY KAISER WILHELM I OF GERMANY IN FAVOR OF THE U.S. TODAY SAN JUAN COUNTY IS KNOWN AS A PLACE OF EXCEPTIONAL UNTAMED BEAUTY, HOME TO BALD EAGLES, ORCA WHALES, PORPOISES, OTTERS AND DEER.
